CODIFICATION ADOPTING ORDINANCE

The City of Negaunee, State of Michigan ORDAINS:

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance is to enact a code of ordinances for the City of Negaunee, State of Michigan, revising, amending, restating, codifying and compiling certain existing general and specific ordinances of the City of Negaunee dealing with subjects embraced in such Code of Ordinances and/or declaring of emergencies.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the present general and permanent ordinances of the City of Negaunee are inadequately arranged and classified and are unsatisfactory in form and substance for the complete preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the municipality and for the proper conduct of its affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Michigan empower and authorize the City of Negaunee to revise, amend, restate, codify and compile any existing ordinances and all new ordinances not heretofore adopted or published and to incorporate such ordinances into one ordinance in book form; and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Authority of the City of Negaunee has authorized a general compilation, revision and codification of the ordinances of a general and permanent nature and publication of such ordinance in book form; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide for the usual daily operation of the municipality and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the municipality that this ordinance take effect at an early date.

Section 1. Code of Ordinances.

The general ordinances of the Political Subdivision as revised, amended, restated, codified, and compiled in book form are hereby adopted as and shall constitute the "Code of Ordinances of the City of Negaunee, State of Michigan.

Section 2. Titles.

Such Code of Ordinances as adopted in Section 1 shall consist of the following Titles with chapters, subchapters and sections:

Title I: General Provisions;

Title II: Administration;

Title V: Public Works;

Title VII: Traffic Code;

Title IX: General Regulations;

Title XI: Business Regulations;

Title XIII: General Offenses;

Title XV: Land Usage; and

Table of Special Ordinances.

Section 3. Repealer.

All prior ordinances pertaining to the subjects treated in such Code of Ordinances shall be deemed repealed from and after the effective date of this Ordinance except as they are included and reordained in whole or in part in such Code; provided, such repeal shall not affect any offense committed or penalty incurred or any right established prior to the effective date of this ordinance, nor shall such repeal affect the provisions of ordinances levying taxes, appropriating money, annexing or detaching territory,

Section 4. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) calendar days from publication.

Section 5. Enforcement.

Such Code shall be in full force and effect as provided in Section 4, and such Code shall be presumptive evidence in all courts and places of the ordinance and all provisions, sections, chapters, subchapters, penalties and regulations therein contained and of the date of passage, and that the same is properly signed, attested, recorded, and approved and that any public hearings and notices thereof as required by law have been given.

To: Used SCBA for Fire Hall

In November 2021 the firehall went out on bids for Used SCBA. One bid was received from Shawano Fire Dept in the amount of \$40,000. \$32,000 was budgeted at that time and the Council approved to accept the bid and draw down the fund balance of the equipment fund by \$8,000 to purchase the equipment. The budget adjustment and purchase did not happen as the fire dept did not receive the equipment in 2021.

The fire hall has just received the equipment but no money was put in the budget for 2022.

RECOMMENATION:

Approve the purchase of the SCBA from the Shawano Fire Dept and draw down the fund balance of the equipment millage by \$40,000 to make the purchase.



BACKGROUND: The current fence at the city cemetery is in a degrading condition. The fence has been neglected for quite some time (please see the attached photos). We are at the point where a decision needs to be made about the fence. There are three options below, of course, you could decide to choose none of these options as well.

Please note that I, (the City Manager) have instructed roughly 1700 feet of fence to be removed from the 492-corridor in order to properly remove dead and dying trees along the fence line. This project will take approximately 2-years to complete.

Upon review of the fence that was removed, approximately 75% of the fence is salvageable and could be reused. The fencing that was not reusable was sent to the recycling facility (see pictures).

RECOMMENATION:

Option #1: Do not remove any additional fencing, except those sections where necessary. Reinvest in the fence under the Negaunee Cemetery Fence Restoration Project as proposed.

Negaunee Cemetery Fence Restoration Project

Over the next three-six years, rehabilitation of the fence will take place. This includes reinstalling the fence that was taken down and supplemented with other sections of fence from the current fencing that is inaccessible to the public in areas of the cemetery that will not likely be used.

The reinstalling of the fence includes two options: (a) reinstall the fence and invite the public to scrape, prime, and paint the fencing or, (b) have the fencing professionally sandblasted, primed, and painted.

Simultaneously, while the sections of the fencing are reinstalled over the next several years. Other sections of fencing will be cleared of smaller trees and brush that have grown around or near the fencing (both sides). This will allow access to the public for scraping, priming, and painting under an established volunteer program. In some cases, a professional firm may need to be called in to remove trees and brush.

Where necessary, sections of fence will be removed and replaced. While some sections may be relocated to avoid snow loads that have severely damaged sections of fencing along Forge Road and Sandy Drive.

BACKGROUND:

The city has been working to rehabilitate the old water works building located on Teal Lake. If rehabilitated, the building would need to be used for recreational purposes only. A committee has been convened for this purpose and will have a report later this fall for city council to review. However, in order to preserve this building until a project can be realized, its recommended that the shingles be replaced. The building has also been reviewed for structural integrity and has been found to be sound.
