Librarian's Report

The library continues to be utilized by local groups as a meeting location. Last week, the Marquette Food Co-op had a meeting in the Michigan Room. This coming Saturday, the Negaunee Lions Club will meet in the Reading Room. Libraries are safe, quiet, convenient places for groups to hold meetings, and it is wonderful that more organizations are using this library for this purpose.

The Money Smart Week storytime session on Tuesday, April 26, was well attended, incorporating a class from Little Friends. The Negaunee branch manager of Honor Credit Union, Jamie Gollakner, read one of the stories and gave the children piggy banks. The children also received a free book, courtesy of Michigan's Credit Unions.

Local author D. Michael Carriere's book-signing session on Friday, May 13, was poorly attended. The media had not advertised the event. Pamela Christensen, director of the Superiorland Library Cooperative, did attend. Mr. Carriere donated his four latest books, which are children's books about trees, to the library.

The library will be closed for Memorial Day weekend, Saturday, May 28, through Monday, May 30. Summer hours (closed Saturdays) will begin that weekend.

Summer reading programming will launch Monday, June 13. Programs will be offered for all ages. The library will also begin "1,000 Books Before Kindergarten," an initiative to get parents and caregivers to read 1,000 books or more to their child, to better help them prepare for learning to read.
