2nd Annual Jackson Mine Park Temporary Campground Plans

FEBRUARY 21, 2023
ORE TO SHORE MOUNTAIN BIKE EPIC

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I. Introduction

The Ore to Shore, in conjunction with the City of Negaunee, is creating a temporary campground in downtown Negaunee for the second year in a row. Just blocks away from both the Hard Rock and Soft Rock start lines, this campground will feature 31, tent only, campsites and 2 hammock campsites and will be available only to Ore to Shore registered participants.

Located at Jackson Mine Park, campers will have great access to food, drink, and shopping in downtown Negaunee, R.A.M.B.A trails, the Iron Ore Heritage Trail, the Old Town Disc Golf Course, and the start line to both the Soft Rock and Hard Rock races.

II. General

- Location: Jackson Mine Park, Negaunee MI
- Operating Dates: Friday August 11th, 2023 – Sunday August 13th, 2022
- Campsites: 33 (all sites are walk-in primitive)
- 89 Parking spots
- No fires, no open container alcohol, no consumption of marijuana
 - Open container allowed if following Negaunee’s social district rules
- Must be registered for 2023 Ore to Shore to reserve a campsite
- Release of liability form signed by all guests
- Quiet hours from 10:00 PM to 8:00 AM (Midnight – 8AM on August 13th)

III. Check-In/Check-Out

- Check-In: August 11th, 4:00 PM – 9:30 PM
- Check-out: Sunday, August 13th by 2:00 PM
- Upon Check-In, Guests Will Be Supplied with:
 - Parking Pass
 - Campground Rules and Information
 - Negaunee Shopping & Eating Guide
 - Personal garbage bag

IV. Ore to Shore Staff Responsibilities

- A. **Campground Manager:** Nic Tuma
 - Campground planning, setup, and takedown
 - Management of staff/volunteers
- B. **Camp Host**
 - Present at all times during the day (7am – midnight)

- Check-in guests
- Patrol campground during the day
- Maintain facilities as needed
 - Clean and re-stock bathrooms
 - Empty garbage cans
 - Clean porta-potties
 - Dispose of trash in Ore to Shore dumpster
 - Pick up litter
 - Park clean-up at end of event

C. Security

- Present at the following times
 - Nighttime: 12:00AM – 7:00 AM
 - Guest check-in: August 11th, 4:00 PM – 9:30 PM
 - Saturday night by fire and open container area: August 12th, 8:00PM - 12:00AM

V. Camp Sites

- (31) 15'x20' primitive camp sites
- (2) 15'x 20' primitive hammock camp sites
- Maximum 4 people per site
- Maximum of 2 tents per site
- Campground zones marked off from public bike path
- Site boundaries marked using flags/stakes and temporary paint
- Minimum of 6' between each site
- 15' wide walkways to access all sites

VI. Parking

- Michigan Health Department parking lot requirement: Parking space = 1.5 x # of sites
 - 30 sites x 1.5 = at least **45 parking spaces required.**

- Parking space size = 9' x 23'
- Signs at parking lot entrances stating "parking pass required"
- Parking passes will be distributed upon guest check-in and will be required to be shown in car windshield to park in lot
- All handicap spots will be left available to the public
- Parking lot layouts shown in appendix

VII. Camp Host Station & Service Areas

1. Camp Host Station:

- Located so that camp host can see entire campground
- Guest check-in and information

2. Service Area #1: Community Fire and Open container space

- Used only from 8pm to 11:59pm, August 12th (Saturday Night)
- Pavilion rented by O2S during this time and included in Service area
- Fire contained in raised and covered fire apparatus
- Open container alcohol permitted for campground guests (within service area)
- Area boundaries marked
- Water hose placed near firepit (water supplied from Pavilion spicket)
- Possibility of acoustic band to play music (no speakers)

3. Service Area #2: Porta-Potties and Hand wash station

- Tobin street blocked by City of Negaunee for duration of event spanning from Peck St. to Jackson Street.
- (1) hand wash station and (14) porta potties to be supplied by:
 - Stenberg Bros. Inc.
 - Gwinn, MI
 - (906)-346-6083

VIII. Facilities

The Michigan health department requires

- 2 unisex privies for every 30 camp sites in a primitive temporary campground
- 1 potable water source for every 50 camp sites
- Sufficient garbage can access emptied weekly

Per this regulation, the Ore to Shore will supply:

(14) Porta Potties (unisex bathrooms)

(1) Hand Wash Station

(1) Potable Water Supply

(10) Garbage cans (emptied daily or as necessary) – (6 supplied by O2S, 4 already present)

The supplied facilities in addition to the Jackson Mine Park Pavilion bathrooms exceeds the health department requirement.




Figure 2. Camping Zone #1: Site Layout




Figure 8. Parking Lot #3 Layout




Figure 9. Parking Lot# 4 Layout
