### Secretary of State offers services at senior center

The Secretary of State will be offering appointments at the Negaunee Senior Center in April.

Any senior citizen (60+) in Marquette County is able to get their Secretary of State business done by appointment on Tuesday, April 16 at the Negaunee Senior Center during their mobile office hours. Their staff will be able to renew IDs, transfer titles, apply for or renew handicapped

permits and ask questions about licenses, titles and other matters.

Secretary of State staff will be available for appointments from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The services are also open to drop-ins, but wait times may vary depending on how many appointments are in progress.

Transactions that can be completed on April 16 at the Negaunee Senior Center include:

### Estate planning set for April 9

The Negaunee Senior Citizens Center will host attorney Jacob Spear for a free educational presentation about protecting your assets from nursing home costs.

The presentation will take place at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, April 9. Please call to RSVP in advance.

Whether you are concerned about losing your home or camp to pay for nursing home care, or want to help a loved one navigate this process, this event will provide you with information at an easy-to-understand level.

This topic is what senior center staff and our clinic attorney gets the most questions about from our clients, and a common topic that comes up during our free monthly legal clinic.

These conversations need to take place with a knowledgeable elder law attorney before a crisis or hospitalization occurs so that families can make the best decision for their situation.

Spear has been practicing Elder Law for seven years and is licensed in both Wisconsin and Michigan. He practices with Heirloom Law Group P.C., which has offices in Marquette and Iron Mountain and serves the entire Upper Peninsula.

### Listening sessions offered in April

A series of Senior Housing Listening Sessions will be held at the Negaunee Senior Center. These sessions are designed to provide information and answer questions concerning a recently rezoned parcel of land near the area known as Old Town.

City staff will be recommending senior housing for the use of this property. According to the latest Target Market Analysis report by LandUseUSA, 47 percent of existing homeowners in Marquette County are above the age of 60, with renters in

that same age group at 27 percent.

These sessions will be important to engage with community members and solicit comments/suggestions from seniors on their housing needs. This information will be used for future senior housing projects.

Listening session will be held from 9 to 11 a.m. on April 23, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. April 25, from 9 to 11 a.m. May 14, and from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. May 16. Each session will be held at the Negaunee Senior Center, located at 410 Jackson Street in Negaunee.

### Senior Services Corner

Free telephones available for senior citizens with hearing loss

No-cost captioned telephones are available for senior citizens. Requirements are high-speed internet, an electrical outlet and any verifiable hearing loss.

The "CapTel" phones have real-

time captions so you can read what the caller is saying, voice amplification, caller ID and speed dial. They are up to four times louder than a regular phone and have tone control for optimal hearing.

These are not mobile phones; they work in your home with a wifi connection. They are available through a federal grant.

The Negaunee Senior Center offers the following services:

• Case Coordination—Meet with our social worker, who can

help with a variety of things, including Meals on Wheels and other food assistance. Please call in advance to schedule a time to meet.

- Financial Management—Help understanding insurance and other bills, balancing checkbooks, etc. We have a certified counselor on staff to help with Medicare questions and enrollment.
- Homemaker Aide—General light household cleaning, laundry, light meal preparation, etc.
- **Respite** Care—Seniors or their live-in caregivers may qualify to have an in-home worker come to the home while the caregiver runs errands.
- Grocery Shopping Homebound clients may be eligible to have someone shop for them.

Income is not a factor in whether or not you qualify for in-home services. Physical and health factors are considered, as well as available assistance in the home.

The Negaunee Senior Center will be offering a tulip riverboat cruise in Belgium and the Netherlands and a tour to Costa Rica in 2025.


The riverboat cruise is tentatively set for April 2025 and Costa Rica is tentatively scheduled for

Flyers, pricing and dates are not yet available, but will be mailed to those on our international group travel mailing list as soon as they are.


