

Permitted Parking Program

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is Negaunee's Permitted Parking Program?

A: The Negaunee's Permitted Parking Program was created to help provide parking in Downtown Negaunee for residents that do not have overnight parking accommodations and that live in the downtown district.

Q: How do I get a permit?

A: Landlords must apply in-person to the Negaunee Police Department in order to be considered for a permit. Permits will not be issued to tenants by the Negaunee Police Department.

Q: How long is a permit good for?

A: Until the seasonal pass has expired or if a temporary pass, at 7PM of the expiration date.

Q: Where are the parking lots?

A: Please refer to the attached map for locations.

Q: How much does it cost?

A: Annual passes for the 2024 season are set at \$600. A day pass is \$10.

Q: What happens when it snows?

A: Accumulation of 3-inches or more requires that the permit holder (the vehicle the pass is in or affixed to) must move their vehicle by 7:00 AM or upon the request of the city.

Q: Can my vehicle be towed?

A: Yes, should you be in any violation of the rules of the Permitted Parking Program or other traffic code violations. Please note, this will be at the owner's expense, each towing company prices differ.

Q: Can I pick my space?

A: No, but you may request. Parking space allotment is at Police Department's discretion.

Q: Who enforces this program?

A: The Negaunee Police Department.

Q: Are there any fines?

A: Yes, for numerous infractions. Please refer to the Permitted Parking Program handout.
